#### TRIBAL MEMBER COMMENT:

Rose Sylvia: Years ago Green Diamond blocked out us out, we bought a portable cattle pen to round up and hold our cows. Community members got mad because we were doing this. We are here today and now these are the Tribe's cows. You say you said that cows do damage, but they also clean up the river bar. If you look at Pecwan Creek everything is overgrown. When I was growing up there was nothing but a sand bar. What we thought about science today and it might not be good later. I know we have hunters of our own and we don't need to hire someone to come do that. These cows are the same cows. They travel. I think that some things being said are wrong. These cows don't belong to you. I don't like that the way leadership is looking at it.

Cindy Niles: You guys came in and killed cows that were owned by tribal members. We are not getting notices of them being hunting and we were supposed to be noticed if they are branded so we can get our cows. Now you guys are saying you're coming into Pecwan, I haven't heard anything about being notified. You are making it so we can't make a living off the cows. I think you're rude, really rude. You guys just kills the cows, next you will be trying to kill the horses. We as tribal members should have a say, what the hell is the matter with you guys?
