I have even sent messages, proof from my clients. But I have been denied. I think there was misunderstanding from the Board on how my business operates. Can I talk about this to you all? I have talked to the program staff numerous times; I am wondering why I've been denied. I have lots of proof. In the ordinance it talks about all seasons, all species and for them (the Board) to think that it was solely for the fall fisheries. I guide year around, in the Spring, Fall and Winter. I want to see if we can change the Fish Guide to not just be included for the Fall Fisheries. There are tribal guides who fish in the winter for steelhead. So maybe we need to broaden our term for the Fish Guides?

Chairman James asks Deputy Executive Director Earl Jackson to follow up on this question for the tribal member.
